After working as a teacher, dorm parent, and football coach at Kents Hill, a New England boarding school where he taught the full spectrum of mathematics from algebra through calculus, **Bryce DeBoer** is ready to bring his infectious positive energy and history of significant student support to the St. Paul's mathematics department. Bryce earned his bachelor's degree in mathematics from St. Lawrence University and has done teacher training at the University of Virginia. A graduate of Georgia Tech with degrees in Computer Science (B.S.) and Human-Computer Interaction (M.S.), Scott will be teaching our IB computer science and sophomore computer science electives in addition to extracurricular work with our STEM, robotics, and video game programs.

**Hannah Macquarrie** has always known that she would be a teacher; her degrees from Colby College and Johns Hopkins furthered her expertise, as did her teaching experiences at St. Paul's in Concord and Pacific Ridge in Carlsbad. At the same time, her love of literature received its own boost through her studies at NYU. Now she is eager to join the Crusaders of St. Paul's, where not only will she be teaching English and working with our student yearbook editors to deftly craft the written word, but also where she will be modeling flexibility, empathy, teamwork, and community.

After earning his degree from U. Chicago, where he was a captain of the crew team, the Upper School's new chaplain, **Christopher Phillips**, began his career teaching social studies and AP History, whence he was pulled into higher education.
