

**Bridges at St. Paul’s School
Information on the Class of 2012**

On July 27, 2012 Bridges will graduate sixteen students from its six-year elementary and middle grades program. Fourteen of the sixteen students in the graduating class have participated in the program for five or six years. The other two students have participated for four years each. The high schools each student will be entering this fall are listed below. Most are entering magnet schools with academic entrance criteria.

The Class of 2012 is the ninth class of students to complete the six-year program. Since the first class to graduate in 2004, Bridges has (a) increased the number of student graduates per class and (b) improved retention over the course of the six year experience.

The Class of 2012 in comparison to previous graduating classes

- Class of 2012: 16 graduates, 88% participated for 5 or 6 summers
- Class of 2011: 22 graduates, 72% participated for 5 or 6 summers
- Class of 2010: 18 graduates, 67% participated for 5 or 6 summers
- Class of 2009: 17 graduates, 82% participated for 5 or 6 summers
- Class of 2008: 19 graduates, 79% participated for 5 or 6 summers
- Class of 2007: 16 graduates, 75% participated for 5 or 6 summers
- Class of 2006: 18 graduates; 61% participated for 5 or 6 summers
- Class of 2005: 16 graduates; 43% participated for 5 or 6 summers
- Class of 2004: 11 graduates; 36% participated for 5 or 6 summers
